

# Potential Double Yellow Lines Outside Wick Surgery

## South Glos Council -Waiting Restriction Review

### URGENT - PLEASE RESPOND ONLINE CONSULTATION CLOSES 9<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER

We have just been given notice that there are plans to put double yellow lines in a number of areas in Wick, including the area outside the surgery. We are concerned that this will impair the ability of elderly, frail and less mobile people to access the surgery when the car park is full. Our car park is relatively small and we have no ability to increase this.

The review also plans to review many other areas of Wick mainly around Naishcombe Hill / Milford Avenue / Boyd Close including the introduction of some Resident Permits. Local residents will have views about these as well – and we encourage you to submit your views online, as this seems to be the main way of overturning / amending these proposals.

#### Our main objections which you can consider using if you agree:

- Local residents need and have a right to access their surgery, and demand is increasing.
- Double yellow lines will disadvantage the least mobile- elderly, disabled and vulnerable people.
- Double yellow lines on the main road will increase traffic speed and volume, in an area that is supposed to be traffic calmed.
- Increased traffic speed causes risk to pedestrian and patient safety.
- Parked cars have a traffic calming effect – slows down vehicles approaching the surgery.
- It just moves the parked cars further up or down the road.
- No public transport alternatives for most.
